[Recommendation Letters]

- (1) Letters must be written in English.
- (2) Letters without a signature of the recommender are not acceptable.
- (3) Letters must be written "To Nippon Music Foundation".
- (4) Letters must be submitted by the applicant.
- (5) Extra letters are not acceptable.
- (6) (QUARTET) Two recommendation letters are required for a quartet.

[Audiovisual Recordings of Your Playing]

(1) Category A and B: Applicants must submit 3 separate recordings selected from the repertoire as listed below.

Category C: Applicants must submit 3 separate recordings of your choice regardless of the repertoire as listed below.

 (Both movements must be from the same sonata and must be recorded at the same time.)

- Prelude, Allemande, Sarabande, and Gigue from Bach Solo Suites
 (All four movements must be from the same suite and recorded at the same time.)
- 2) All movements from one of the five Beethoven Sonatas for Piano and Cello (All movements must be recorded at the same time.)
- 3) One concerto of your choice from the Romantic period onwards. (Piano accompaniment is acceptable. All movements must be recorded at the same time.)

Quartet (All movements must be recorded at the same time.) 1) One quartet from Beethoven Op.18, 59, 74, 95 2) One quartet from the Romantic period 3) One quartet from the early 20th century onwards (2) Recordings must be made within 12 months from the start date of Application Period. (3) The recordings must clearly show the applicant's hands and face. (4) The recordings must be uploaded to an online file storage service (such as Google Drive or WeTransfer) or submitted by the multimedia file formats viewable with Windows Media Player 12. The links for video streaming sites such as YouTube are not acceptable. (5) Do not directly send the files by email. (6) Poor sound or visual quality recordings may not be accepted.
